Adult Winter Reading Program



Every winter Wolfner Library offers an Adult Winter Reading Program. Each year features a unique theme and a customized list of 100 titles to read. Divided into 10 categories, the list includes a wide variety of fiction and non-fiction books. Prizes are awarded to top readers and there is a drawing for participation prizes.

Book Clubs

Wolfner Library offers three themed book clubs via conference call for patrons. These include:



- Novel Reads, general fiction book club.
- Big Ideas, non-fiction book club.
- Good Books, mild reads book club. This club will read fiction and non-fiction books that feature little-to-no sex, violence, or strong language.

Patrons can join as many of the clubs as they wish.

Workshops via Conference Call



Wolfner Library offers occasional workshops by conference call. These are announced in the newsletter and are open to all patrons and/or their caregivers. Past topics have included utilizing WolfPAC, the online catalog, and using BARD (Braille and Audio Reading Download).



Wolfner Library's YOUTH PROGRAMS



Summer Reading Club

Wolfner Library offers a yearly youth Summer Reading Club from May 30th-July 30th. Participants keep track of time read during the program. Prizes are awarded to top readers and two grand prizes are given to a winner from each age category: ages 2-12 and ages 13-18.



Early Literacy Program

Throughout the course of one year, books and early literacy materials will be sent every other month to children enrolled in the program. These items are designed to help children and their caregivers build early literacy and pre-braille skills.



Teen Poetry Contest

Wolfner Library offers a teen poetry contest for patrons ages 13-18 every year from October 15th-December 12th. Prizes are awarded to the top three poets and their poems are published in the Spring Wolfner Library Newsletter.



S.T.E.M. Kits

Wolfner Library offers kits focused on science, technology, engineering, and/or math for youth. These kits are meant to help support S.T.E.M. in schools and can be used by homeschooled patrons.
