Family Inclusion: Holding and Making the Most of Special **Events**

About Me

I have been a preschool teacher for 15 years. The last 3 years I have served as Assistant Director of the East location of the Academy of Early Childhood Learning in Columbia, MO.

During those 15 years, I have observed, helped host and helped plan several special events during the school year.

Goal For This Session

For this next hour, I would like to share with you the events that the Academy holds throughout the year, special things we do to include families and how we plan for them. You will see pictures of many of the events and I will answer any questions that you have about them.

You will also have the opportunity to share events that your school holds.

Let's get started!

Importance of Special Events

Special events are important because including families in the learning environment improves the academic and social growth of the child.

The families feel more connected and it becomes much easier to work with them and talk to them about any issues that may need to be communicated.

Families also tend to stay at your center or school longer, if they feel like part of a family. One of the biggest things the Academy hears when a family leaves is how much they are going to miss our teachers and events. Often, families will keep in contact with us and will say that they can not find another place for their child like the Academy.

What Studies Show

We can all attest to the fact that parent involvement is ideal because we have seen the benefits first hand, but in case we need some quick reminders:

Here are two studies that offer insight into the benefits of parent-school partnerships:

"Researchers at the University of Oxford found that children whose parents participated in the Peers Early Education Partnership (a program geared towards supporting families of children ages 0-5) "made significantly greater progress in their learning than children whose parents did not participate." These strides were found in children ages 3-5, and included progress in vocabulary, language comprehension, understanding of books and print and number concepts. In addition, these children also exhibited higher self-esteem in comparison to children of non-participating parents (Evangelou & Sylva, 2003)."

"A study published in the *Journal of Instructional Psychology* reported that improving parental involvement in the classroom can also improve schools in general (Machen, Wilson & Notar, 2005). The authors describe how everyone within the school community can benefit when parents and teachers work as partners."

Sweets With Your Sweetie

This event is held on or before Valentine's Day from 7-9 am.

Donuts, muffins and fruit is bought/ordered and prepared a few days before to the day before the event so that it will be ready to be set out when we open at 6:30 on the morning of the event. Milk, water, juice and coffee for the parents is also served.

Set up (tables, chairs and decorations) in the room happens mostly the evening before so that very little needs to be done the morning of the event. There are also photo opportunities for the families. This is also set up the evening before the event.

Directions to the room are provided by staff upon arrival so that families are ready to attend upon arrival that morning.

Any children that do not eat with their parents still get the sweets we are serving to the families that attend.

Signs are put up around the school two weeks before and then emailed to parents a day or two before as well as a note on daily sheets and in the monthly newsletter.

Classroom Valentine's Day Parties

This event takes place on the same day as Sweets with Your Sweetie, in the afternoon after nap time.

If a child is without a family member, the teacher takes them under their wing.


Class Halloween Parties/Boo Blast

This event is held the Thursday before Thanksgiving at our South location and the Friday before Thanksgiving at our East location during lunch, with a rotation for eating times and buffets.

This is our largest event held during the day during the school year.


Signups for parents go on the classroom doors about 3 weeks ahead of the event with many reminders.


At the East location there are 3 buffets with three different times, 11, 11:20, 11:40 and a seating chart is made for each family. At East set up starts at about 9 the morning of the event and then cleanup starts as soon as the families are finished with the first buffet, usually at about 11:40.


At the South location there is one buffet with two different times and a seating chart is made for each family. South set up starts the day before the event because they use a downstairs area and do not need to use classrooms. Clean up starts when both buffets are complete, about 12:30.


Food is ordered about a week and a half before the event and started being cooked the week of the event. The Academy provides turkey, stuffing, rolls, potatoes and green beans.

Families sign up to bring other sides and desserts on the sign up at East or on Sign Up Genius at South.



Classroom Holiday Parties

These parties all happen on the same day throughout both centers. Usually on about the second Friday of December at 3 pm, after nap time.

The class makes keepsakes for their parents and prepare a song or two or poem to present for the parents.

For families with children in multiple classes, the teachers work together to stagger the presentation times so that families can attend all presentations.









Other Ways to Include Families

At the Academy we do two other things to include families throughout the year.

During the first week of March we hold Dr. Seuss week. During this time we invite families to write down any books they read during the week and we make a hat for Cat in the Hat with red and white striped paper.

During November, we put up a Thankful Turkey and provide a feather for all of our families to fill out and return.

We have an open door policy for parents and encourage teachers to invite parents at anytime that their lesson plans might allow for visits, like special readers.

The Academy has also just started using the app, Homeroom. This app allows teachers to take pictures and video from the classroom iPad and upload to the app to the child's "account". Parents then receive a text stating that a picture or video has been uploaded for them to view. This does take some time to set up and stipulations need to be in place to ensure that teachers are sending positive information about the child's day to the parents.





Putting together these events can be very time consuming. I am going to let you in on the organizational tips we have found along the way to help with the time consuming parts of planning and holding events.

If it is the first time you are deciding to hold an event, start planning at least a couple of months ahead so that you will think of everything that you will need and have time to get the needed items.

For smaller events, like class parties and Sweets With Your Sweetie, there is not a lot that is needed. This will mean that you will likely have to guess about how much you will need as far as donuts, muffins and fruit because you will not likely know how many will be attending. To help with your guess for the first time you hold the event, you can send an email or start talking to parents about a week a head so that you can get the food ordered. Tables and chairs can be the tables and chairs you already have since it is a staggered event with families coming and going.

For larger events, like the Feast, you should get the best estimate you can because you may have to rent tables and chairs and you will have more food to order.

The Academy uses Google Drive to organize our notes for the events. We keep the notes for the previous year to review as time gets closer to the event so that we can make guesses for the current year. In the notes we include things like, number of attendees, how many people we had working the event, when we started preparing things for the event and what needs to be changed for next year; for example, locations of parts of the buffets. We also keep contact information of places we rent items from and what and how much we rented.

Google Drive is a free service provided to anyone with a Google email account. The Academy pays for our staff emails since we have many staff members between both centers, but your school does not necessarily have to.

You could have your staff create their own work email, for example, firstnamenameofcenter@gmail.com. You can use last initials if you have more than one staff member with the same name. You can also do this with only staff members who will be involved with planning. If you do this, you will have less control as far as what is being sent out in the centers name and when, which could potentially lead to some issues. To prevent these issues, if you are not ready for your entire staff to have email, you can limit it to the staff doing the planning.

From there you can get into Drive and start creating Folders for events and then documents within the folders, like signs and signups. If you are interested in learning more about Google Drive, you can see me at the end of this session and I will gladly show you how to create it and how I have my Drive set up.

Finally, and probably one of the most important things, is to communicate your vision to your staff and explain how events help foster great relationships with families and keep families around longer because they feel like they are part of the school family.

Explain that it will take work from all staff, but that it will be worth it. If at all possible, keep any help that you have during their normal hours. For our Feast, that is not possible because our teachers are with their students. In that case, we ask our part timers who usually come in the afternoon if they are available to help during any part of the event. This usually gets us the help we need.
